

ORDINANCE NO. _____

1 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 8-1 (*PARKS ADMINISTRATION*) AND
2 CHAPTER 12-5 (*STOPPING, STANDING, AND PARKING*) OF THE CITY CODE
3 RELATING TO PARK USE, ENFORCEMENT, PARKING AND DRIVING
4 RESTRICTIONS AT PARKS, AND SOUND EQUIPMENT AT PARKS; LIMITS
5 ON SPECIAL EVENT DAYS AT CERTAIN PARKS; CREATING OFFENSES
6 AND ESTABLISHING PENALTIES.

7 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

8 **PART 1.** City Code Section 8-1-1 (*Definitions*) is amended to add new definitions
9 for “Approval”, “City Vehicle”, “Commercial Activity”, “Compensation”,
10 “Special Event”, and “Watercraft” and to amend the existing definitions for
11 “Nature Preserve”, “Public Recreation Area”, and “Sound Equipment” to read as
12 follows and to renumber the remaining definitions accordingly:

13 (1) APPROVAL means a permit, reservation agreement, or other written
14 document that evidences an authorization by the department.

15 (4) CITY VEHICLE means a motor vehicle owned by the City and operated
16 by a City employee.

17 (5) COMMERCIAL ACTIVITY means to advertise or provide a good,
18 service, class, or instructional activity for compensation.

19 (6) COMPENSATION means any money, thing of value, payment, reward,
20 tip, consideration, donation, gratuity, or profit paid to, accepted by, or
21 received by a person.

22 (9 [11]) NATURE PRESERVE means a parcel of land or place designated
23 for the protection and preservation of wildlife, including a wildlife
24 sanctuary, and unique ecological and scenic features [~~including a~~
25 ~~wildlife sanctuary~~].

26 (11 [6]) PUBLIC RECREATION AREA means a park, recreational facility,
27 athletic field, building, swimming pool, playground, nature preserve,
28 [~~wildlife sanctuary,~~] trail, dock, or greenbelt [~~owned or~~] managed,
29 maintained, or operated by the department or on the department’s behalf
30 [~~a governmental entity~~].

1 (14 [7]) SOUND EQUIPMENT means loud speaker, microphone, public
2 address system, amplification system, turntable, or other similar digital
3 or analog device that amplifies a voice or other sound [~~has the meaning~~
4 ~~prescribed in Section 9-2-1 (Definitions) of the Code~~].

5 (15) SPECIAL EVENT means an activity that anticipates 1,000 or more
6 attendees and is conducted pursuant to an approval that allows for the
7 exclusive use of all or part of the public recreation area for the activity.

8 (17) WATERCRAFT means a boat or other structure designed to float on
9 water.

10 **PART 2.** City Code Section 8-1-3 (*Enforcement*) is amended to add a new
11 Subsection (C) to read as follows:

12 **§ 8-1-3 ENFORCEMENT.**

13 (C) A structure or other personal property used in violation of Section 8-1-12(F)
14 is subject to impoundment consistent with the procedures in Chapter 9-1
15 (*Abandoned Property Vehicles*).

16 **PART 3.** City Code Section 8-1-11 (*Disruption of Authorized Activity Prohibited*)
17 is amended to add a new Subsection (C) to read as follows:

18 **§ 8-1-11 DISRUPTION OF AUTHORIZED ACTIVITY PROHIBITED.**

19 (C) In this section, “authorized activity” includes an activity conducted or
20 provided pursuant to an approval.

21 **PART 4.** City Code Section 8-1-12 (*Permit for Park Use*) is repealed and replaced
22 to read as follows:

23 **§ 8-1-12 APPROVAL FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AREA USE.**

24 (A) An approval is required for a person to:

- 25 (1) reserve a public recreation area;
- 26 (2) fish, camp, or use a specific area in a public recreation area between
27 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.; or
- 28 (3) conduct a commercial activity or a special event in a public recreation
29 area.

30 (B) The director shall grant an approval unless the intended use would result in:

- 31 (1) a scheduling conflict;
- 32 (2) traffic congestion;

- 1 (3) damage to park property or landscape;
- 2 (4) a threat to public health, safety or welfare; or
- 3 (5) a use inconsistent with the purpose of the nature preserve.

4 (C) The director may establish written guidelines to:

- 5 (1) approve an activity described in Subsection (A);
- 6 (2) conduct an activity described in Subsection (A); or
- 7 (3) reserve a public recreation area.

8 (D) An approval issued under this section is not a waiver, exception, or defense
9 to a violation of a guideline established by the director or the requirements
10 of the City Code.

11 (E) A person must comply with an approval, including any conditions,
12 department guidelines, or rules, and City Code requirements.

13 (F) A person may not use a structure or other personal property for a
14 commercial activity unless the structure or personal property is included in
15 the approval.

16 (G) A person may not board individuals from a park or dock managed,
17 maintained, or operated by or on behalf of the department onto a watercraft
18 used for a commercial activity without an approval.

19 (H) A person may not disembark individuals from a watercraft used for a
20 commercial activity onto a park or dock managed, maintained, or operated
21 by or on behalf of the department without an approval.

22 (I) A person must display an approval to a peace officer or City employee when
23 requested.

24 (J) Except as provided in Subsection (K), a person who fails to comply with
25 Subsections (A), (E), (F), (G), (H), or (I) commits a misdemeanor offense
26 punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500 and not less than \$100. A culpable
27 mental state is not required, and need not be proved.

28 (K) A person who fails to comply with Subsections (A), (E), (F), (G), (H), or (I)
29 during a special event commits a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine
30 not to exceed \$500 and not less than \$200. A culpable mental state is not
31 required, and need not be proved.

32 **PART 5.** City Code Section 8-1-13 (*Fee for Park Use; Exception*) is amended to
33 amend Subsection (A) to read as follows:

1 **§ 8-1-13 FEE FOR PARK USE; EXCEPTION.**

2 (A) Except as provided in this section, a person shall pay a fee or charge
3 established by ordinance for the use of a public recreation area [~~park~~] or a
4 recreational facility [~~activity~~].

5 **PART 6.** City Code Section 8-1-14 (*Use of Parks During Certain Hours*
6 *Prohibited*) is repealed and replaced to read as follows:

7 **§ 8-1-14 USE OF PUBLIC RECREATION AREAS DURING CERTAIN**
8 **HOURS PROHIBITED.**

9 (A) Except as provided in Subsection (B), the operating hours of a public
10 recreation area are 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

11 (B) The director may adopt operating hours for a public recreation area by rule.
12 Operating hours adopted pursuant to this subsection are effective when
13 posted at the public recreation area.

14 (C) When considering operating hours for a trail, the director should consider
15 whether the trail was established for the purpose of contributing to the City's
16 transportation infrastructure.

17 (D) A person may not be present at a public recreation area outside of operating
18 hours.

19 (E) It is an affirmative defense to a violation of Subsection (D) if at the time of
20 the alleged violation, the person was present at a public recreation area
21 because the person was participating in or attending an activity conducted in
22 accordance with an approval granted by the department.

23 **PART 7.** Chapter 8-1 (*Parks Administration*) is amended to add a new Section 8-
24 1-15 (*Limits on Special Events*) to read as follows:

25 **§ 8-1-15 LIMITS ON SPECIAL EVENTS.**

26 (A) For purposes of this section, special event days do not include days to set up
27 and take down a special event.

28 (B) Except as provided in Subsections (D) and (E), the Council establishes the
29 maximum number of special event days for the following public recreation
30 areas:

31 (1) Zilker Metropolitan Park is 24 per calendar year;

32 (2) Festival Beach at Edward Rendon Senior Metropolitan Park is 17 per
33 calendar year; and

(3) Auditorium and Vic Mathias Shores at Town Lake Metropolitan Park is 17 per calendar year.

(C) As of June 8, 2017, the reoccurring special events and days used are:

(1) Zilker Metropolitan Park:

1 (D) Council authorizes the continued use of the public recreation areas for the
2 number of special event days described in Subsection (C). If a reoccurring
3 special event described in Subsection (C) does not occur after the effective
4 date of this section, the City Manager may not allow the special event days
5 to be used by a different special event until the number of days used per
6 calendar year is less than maximum established in Subsection (B).

7 (E) In addition to the days authorized in Subsection (B)(3), the City Manager
8 may authorize single day non-reoccurring special events to take place at
9 Auditorium and Vic Mathias Shores at Town Lake Metropolitan Park for a
10 municipal purpose if the total number of special event days does not exceed
11 25 per calendar year. In evaluating a request described by this subsection,
12 the City Manager must consider the following factors:

- 13 (1) a scheduling conflict at the public recreation area or with adjacent
14 properties;
- 15 (2) traffic congestion;
- 16 (3) potential damage to park property or landscape;
- 17 (4) potential threat to public health, safety or welfare;
- 18 (5) availability of city resources required to permit and to provide
19 services to the special event; and
- 20 (6) availability of other public recreation areas for the special event.

21 (F) Nothing in this section limits the City Manager's authority to establish a
22 maximum number of special event days that may be used at other public
23 recreation areas.

24 **PART 8.** City Code Section 8-1-31 (*Restrictions on Motor Vehicle in Park*) is
25 repealed and replaced to read as follows:

26 **§ 8-1-31 USE OF MOTOR VEHICLES IN PARKS.**

27 (A) Except as provided in Subsections (B) and (D), a person may not drive a
28 motor vehicle or motor driven device in a public recreation area.

- 1 (B) A person may drive a motor vehicle on a public roadway and in a parking
2 area of a public recreation area.
- 3 (C) The director may authorize a person to use a motor vehicle or motor driven
4 device in a park or playground.
- 5 (D) Except for a city vehicle, a person must apply to the director for an approval
6 to use a motor vehicle in a park or playground.
- 7 (E) In making a determination under Subsection (C), the director shall consider:
8 (1) potential damage to the park or playground;
9 (2) noise; and
10 (3) public safety and welfare.
- 11 (F) A person must display the approval to a peace officer or City employee
12 when requested.

13 **PART 9.** City Code Section 8-1-32 (*Authorized Use of Motor Vehicle In Park*) is
14 repealed.

15 **PART 10.** City Code Section 8-1-33 (*Restrictions on Parking*) is repealed and
16 replaced to read as follows:

17 **§ 8-1-33 PARKING RESTRICTIONS AND APPROVAL.**

- 18 (A) The director may restrict motor vehicle parking at a public recreation area.
- 19 (B) A person must apply for a permit to park in a place designated as “reserved
20 for patrons” or “special event parking” on a form approved by the director.
- 21 (C) The director may authorize a city vehicle, or a motor vehicle operated by an
22 agent of the City to park in place that is restricted under Subsection (A) or
23 restricted under Section 12-5-44 (*Parking at a Public Recreation Area*).

24 **PART 11.** City Code Section 8-1-45 (*Late Extension*) is repealed and replaced to
25 read as follows:

26 The director may issue a permit for use of sound equipment between 10:00
27 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. if the sound equipment is:

- 28 (1) used or operated on a permanently constructed bandstand;
29 (2) used or operated in a building during an approved activity; or
30 (3) more than 600 feet from any residential property.

1 **PART 12.** City Code Chapter 12-5 (*Stopping, Standing, and Parking*) is amended
2 to add a new Section 12-5-44 to read as follows:

3 **§12-5-44 PARKING AT A PUBLIC RECREATION AREA.**

4 (A) In this section, public recreation area means a park, recreational facility,
5 athletic field, building, swimming pool, playground, nature preserve, trail,
6 dock, or greenbelt managed, maintained, or operated by the Parks and
7 Recreation Department or on its behalf.

8 (B) Except as provided in Subsection (C), a person may park a motor vehicle at
9 a public recreation area only:

10 (1) in a designated parking area; or

11 (2) within 12 feet of the edge of a roadway where parking is authorized;
12 or

13 (3) at the direction of a police officer or an employee of the Parks and
14 Recreation Department.

15 (C) Unless the director of the Parks and Recreation Department issues a parking
16 permit for the motor vehicle, a person may not stand or park a motor vehicle
17 at a public recreation area in a place designated as “reserved for patrons” or
18 “special event parking”.

19 (D) A person may not stop, stand, or park a motor vehicle in a place at a public
20 recreation area designated as “no parking”.

21 (E) A person may not park on the grass at a public recreation area unless
22 directed by a sign or an employee of the Parks and Recreation Department.

23 (F) Section 12-5-90 includes a specific fine for a violation of this section during
24 a special event.

25 **PART 13.** City Code Section 12-5-90 (*Civil Fines, Fees, and Costs*) is amended to
26 add new violations and fine amounts in Subsection (I) to read as follows:

Parking Violation	Standard Fine	Early Payment Fine
<u>Public Recreation Area –</u> <u>During Special Event</u>	<u>\$250</u>	<u>\$125</u>
